Grade: 3rd-5th Grade

In this interactive classroom game, students will explore a variety of factors that led to the ranching economy of the Flint Hills, which also plays a major part in the preservation of this unique region today. Name of Program: The Natural Economy FFNHA theme: Shaping the Frontier

Grade: 6th-8th Grade

Program: Come on into Kansas! Learn how nineteenth century settlers worked with the Flint Hills landscape and used the unique un-tillable uplands of tallgrass prairie for raising cattle. In this historical economy game, students establish their team enterprise in ranching and farming and explore opportunities the Flint Hills offered, all while deciding which lifestyle strategies to employ. Natural resources drove people to the Flint Hills, however, the use of those resources can have consequences. Explore the various natural resources available in the Flint Hills, and experiment with the consequences that come with their utilization. Aligns with Kansas History, Government, and Social Studies Standards.

Name of Program: Exhibit Exploration FFNHA Theme: Shaping the Frontier

Grade: 3rd-12th Grade

Program: Through interactive scavenger hunts and guided activity sheets, students of all ages will discover the culture of the Flint Hills that settlers established moving west during the 19th century. They will uncover the historical forces of war, cattle ranching, settlement, and rail expansion that created the modern Flint Hills. Exhibits also illustrate the consequences of settlement for other cultures and lifestyles including Indian peoples such as the Kaw Nation.
